
Lily Poetry Review Books

Steven Riel reads from *Edgemere*. He's the author of a previous full-length collection of poetry (*Fellow Odd Fellow*) and three chapbooks. His most recent chapbook *Postcard from P-town* was published as runner-up for the inaugural Robin Becker Chapbook Prize. His poems have appeared in several anthologies and numerous periodicals, including *The Minnesota Review* and *International Poetry Review*. He currently serves as editor-in-chief of the Franco-American literary e-journal *Résonance*.



Chloe Yelena Miller reads from *Viable*. She's a writer and teacher living in Washington,D.C., with her partner and their child. Miller has an MFA in creative writing from Sarah Lawrence College and a BA from Smith College. He teaches writing at the University of Pittsburgh.
